Dear Padre,

In the Church's eyes, what constitutes pornography? Art museums have statues of nude men and women, some of which are quite explicit. Is the only difference the respectability of the venue?

The "respectability" of the location or publisher doesn't matter. A product is pornographic if it was created to sexually arouse users of the product regardless of the venue. Michelangelo's intention in carving his famous statue of David was not to arouse the people who look at it, so the Church does not call it pornography.



Pornography has existed for centuries, but it didn't arrive in our homes uninvited until recently. People with internet access are regularly confronted by pornographic images and literature, and many find it a very powerful temptation. In response, the US bishops issued a helpful document, which is available online at usccb.org: *Create in Me a Clean Heart: A Pastoral Response to Pornography*.

From this document: "Using and/or producing pornography is a sin against chastity and against human dignity....The sin of pornography needs the Lord's forgiveness and should be confessed in the sacrament of penance. Pornography objectifies people and brings hurt and pain. It is an illusory substitute for real relationships and intimacy, which in the end bring true joy. Many good people struggle with the sin of pornography and [strive] to cultivate chastity. You are not alone. Jesus is with you, the Church offers you love and support. Trust in the Lord's mercy and his power to free and heal you."

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

still remember because it's pretty much a commentary on how life is for most of us. It goes something like this: At the age of ten, we think we can live forever. When we're twenty, we think we can save the world. When the big thirty rolls around, we think we can save the company. When the fortieth birthday arrives, we think we can save our children. Then, when we're fifty, we think we can at least save our marriage. And by the time we're sixty, we think we should just save aluminum cans.

A bit flippant perhaps, but it reminds me that even given my own best efforts, I really do not save much of anything. It is always God who does the saving, not me.

It's a conversation replayed in our heads again and

again. We find ourselves unwittingly thinking that if we do all the right things, when we die and go to heaven, then God will have to take us in. If we say the right prayers and follow all the rules, then we will have earned salvation. Yet then we will have saved ourselves and there will have been no need for God's gracious goodness. Then we will have lifted ourselves up by our own bootstraps and not by the Lord Jesus.

Then we will proclaim ourselves as the light to overcome darkness, and it will not be the death and resurrection of the Lord which does so.



Q&A

<u>Question:</u> Why do Catholics leave Jesus crucified on the cross in Catholic churches when Jesus is risen?

<u>Answer:</u> Jesus is not "left on the cross" but rather his saving love is displayed. Jesus died for our sins out of love is the central message of a crucifix. The centrality of this to the mission of Jesus on earth is mentioned several times in the New Testament:

For Jews demand signs and Greeks look for wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles. . . (1 Cor. 1:23) "I am troubled now. Yet what should I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? But it was for this purpose that I came to this hour." (Jn. 12:27)

And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life." For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. (Jn. 3:14-16)

Then he took the bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body, which will be given for you; do this in memory of me." And likewise the cup after they had eaten, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which will be shed for you. (Lk. 22:19-20)

God could have chosen any method for the redemption of humanity. In his desire that humanity should know the depravity of sin and the depths of God's love he chose to die on the cross. Displaying a crucifix does not in any way deny the resurrection of Jesus. After all, do faith communities that display only a cross want to downplay the sufferings of Jesus? Of course not, it is just a different preference of emphasis. In the Catholic Church the crucifix has been the traditional sign and statement of our faith in God's love and mercy. It reminds us that Jesus never promised his followers an easy life (Matt. 16:24) but that if we join our sufferings to his, we too we ultimately triumph as he did.



Today, the conflict is between a culture that affirms, cherishes, and celebrates the gift of life, and a culture that seeks to declare entire groups of human beings the unborn, the terminally ill, the handicapped, and others considered "unuseful" to be outside the boundaries of legal protection." - "The new evangelization calls for followers of Christ who are unconditionally pro-life: who will proclaim, celebrate and serve the Gospel of life in every situation." Pope St. John Paul II's Homily during the Eucharistic Celebration, Jan. 27, 1999
- Something that is done unconditionally is done or given freely, without anything being required in return.
 To do something unconditionally means there are no conditions, requirements or stipulations at all.
- <u>Each of us individually</u> as well as in our families, parishes and larger groups must ask ourselves:
 During this time of trial, during this test of character, how will I serve the Gospel of Life by serving mothers and their unborn babies, so that they are not thrown outside the boundaries of legal protection through the passage of a pro-abortion state constitutional amendment?
- Pro-Abortion Groups Announced on Jan 18, 2024, They Have Chosen One of 11 Initiative Petitions to Attempt to Put On the Ballot for the Nov. 5 General Election.
 - Missourians for Constitutional Freedom (MCF) a pro-abortion group which has the support of Abortion
 Access Missouri, the ACLU of Missouri and Planned Parenthood affiliates in Kansas City and St. Louis –
 announced on January 18 that they are getting behind one of the 11 initiative petitions that the group had
 filed in in March 2023.
 - MCF and its supporters have chosen initiative petition <u>2024-086</u>, which would allow abortions in Missouri
 up until the unborn child is viable but states that the "general assembly may enact laws that regulate the
 provision of abortion after Fetal Viability".
 - Note that the legislature would only have permission to "regulate" <u>but not "restrict," "prohibit," "outlaw," etc., abortions of unborn babies.</u> "Regulate" <u>after viability might mean that the abortion can only be performed or induced by a physician. But <u>before viability, abortions could be legally performed or induced without "discriminat[ing] against persons providing ... reproductive health care" (subsection 6).</u></u>
 - But as a practical matter, the initiative petition would effectively allow abortions until birth because:
 [U]nder no circumstance shall the Government deny, interfere with, delay, or otherwise restrict an abortion that in the good faith judgment of a treating health care professional is needed to protect the life or physical or mental health of the pregnant person. (Subsection 4)
 - Thus any "treating health care professional" (not just a physician) could determine in a "pregnant person['s]" seventh, eighth or ninth month that an abortion is needed for "mental health" reasons. The World Health Organization says "mental health" is "a state of mental well-being that enables people to cope with the stresses of life, realize their abilities, learn well and work well, and contribute to their community."

- Pro-Abortion Initiative Petition Signature Gathering Begins February 1, 2024. Deadline to Collect Signatures is May 5, 2024.
- Rep. Deb Lavender (D-Manchester) wrote in her <u>Jan. 21 newsletter</u>: "Signature Collection will Begin February 1, 2024." <u>On Reddit, a volunteer for a grassroots group helping with the petition</u> wrote on Jan. 25:

We were told tonight there will be a kickoff on Tuesday Feb 6th, around 6, in KC, STL, Columbia, & Springfield for people to be the first to sign. Specific locations and times to follow soon.

- Petitions to amend the constitution must be signed by eight percent of legal voters in any six of the eight congressional districts. That is a minimum of 171,592 signatures.
- o Signatures must be submitted to the Missouri Secretary of State by 5:00 PM, May 5, 2024.
- As a practical matter, supporters of any pro-abortion initiative petition must get 300,000 or more signatures by the deadline, since many signatures are invalid, or the signer is in the "wrong" congressional district.
- (Another group called <u>Missouri Women and Family Research Fund</u> claims it is also <u>canvassing for</u> <u>signatures a competing pro-abortion ballot measure</u>, but there doesn't appear to be much activity.)
