

## **Sacramental Preparation**

In order to prepare properly to receive a sacrament, a student must have been in religious education class on year prior to attending a class, which prepares for a sacrament. Student that need attend St. James previously will to provide proof of completion. These sacraments include First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation. The attendance policy will be followed and upheld. Confirmation is a two-year program and students must attend both years to receive the sacrament. Students are expected to attend PSR regularly even after Sacraments are received. Regular attendance and participation in all activities is necessary to receive the Sacraments along with home support. At least one parent is required to attend all parent meetings.
