

God is just so amazing! I've prayed as long as I can remember that I would be able to hear God when He speaks to me and know that it was Him: I'm a slow learner:-(but I am learning. The other day, I was told that a check that was supposed to be split between all siblings had been mailed to just one. It was brought to my attention from another sibling of the concerned that the one who received it would not do right by the others. I worried about it quite a bit, then I just looked up to God and said... "God, you handle this please. I'm just too tired to deal with it today." So for the rest of the evening, I let it go and really was at peace. The next day, I made a call to talk of our concern, but before I could, the rep said they had already canceled the check & were mailing each sibling an individual check for their share.

What does this say to me: that this is satan working in my mind, which affects my actions, and our family unit that is so dear to God. So when I realize this, I immediately pray the St. Michael prayer.

I continue to be reminded that God is the one that's in control and that when we surrender our lives, in every aspect, God will take care of everything. Praise God!
